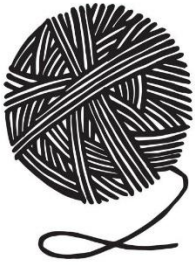

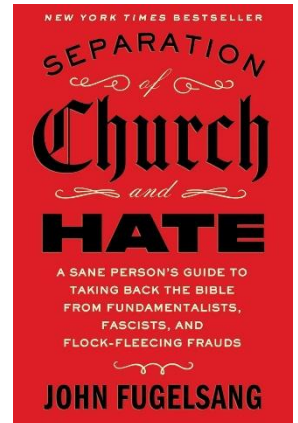


Crochet Group Starting Up Again!

Dear Coworkers in Christ:

It's a new year!!!! I'd thought about asking you where you think the new year will lead you but the problem with that is that we often haven't a clue. Let's face it, God's in charge and not us. That's okay. God is faithful and will always see us through. I like the way that the hymn "Borning Cry," puts things in verse three:

In the Middle Ages of your life not too old, no longer young,
I'll be there to guide you through the night, complete what I've begun
When the evening gently closes in and you shut your weary eyes
I'll be there as I have always been, with just one more surprise.

God has been doing wonderful ministry here and will indeed complete what God's begun. The meeting was not called to order because there was not a Quorum.

Secretary's Report:

Treasurer's Report: Roberta Hansen passed out the Treasurer's Reports for November.

Pastor's Report: Pastor suggested that an increased amount should be budgeted next year in the event that we would have a new Pastor, but she did not want to have her salary increased if she was to remain. Pastor informed the Council that the Barker Family, who are currently living in the parsonage due to a fire in their home, have been cancelled by their insurance company. She recommended that we consider adjusting the monthly amount that they are paying the church for living in the parsonage on a temporary basis. She indicated that wood has been purchased for a bedroom floor at the parsonage and the tenant is working on installing it.

Other items of note:

- Diana needs reports by January 5 for the annual meeting.
- A contract was received for the snow plowing which Sherry signed.

At this point the meeting was cancelled due to the lack of a quorum. The meeting was rescheduled for Sunday, December 21, 2025.

Old Business:

1. Building security update: Nothing at this time.
2. Parsonage update: There was discussion about the need for increased communication about the expenses for the parsonage and what improvements are being made. Dennis volunteered to be our liaison for the parsonage.
3. Furnace in the sanctuary: There was considerable discussion about how to proceed with replacing the furnace in the sanctuary. Teresa has a spare furnace that is not being used and Bruce will discuss with Bill the possibility of getting that installed. There was also discussion about doing some long-range planning for future heating needs.

New Business:

1. Building use requests: There will be a blood drive on January 13, 2026.
2. 2026 budget: Roberta brought a proposed 2026 budget for the Council to discuss and make suggestions. Each line item was discussed and assigned a suggested figure for 2026. Roberta will complete the proposed budget and bring it to the annual meeting for discussion and approval.
3. Items for the annual meeting agenda: Diana will need committee reports by January 5 for the annual meeting.
4. Nominating Committee report: There are three candidates for the three positions on the Council. Those names will be brought to the annual meeting to be voted on.

Open discussion:

3. Information to be included in the monthly Parish Messenger needs to be submitted by the 25th of the month.

Forgiveness and reconciliation – We are reconciled to God by God's forgiving mercy. We recognize and will challenge dynamics of power and privilege that create barriers to participation and equity in this church and society – for women, people of color, minority ethnic groups, people with disabilities, people who are marginalized or living in poverty, and the LGBTQ community.

Courage and openness to change – Because we trust in God's promise and understand faith to be a living, daring confidence in God's grace, we are emboldened to embrace learning and change in our spiritual and institutional journey as church. This means we are open to new ways and willing to take risks to discover God's plan for this church.

Faithful stewardship of God's creation and gifts – As church together, faithful stewardship is about holding to God's purpose and ensuring the responsibilities and resources that God has entrusted to us are used with great care and with accountability to God, to each other and those served by this church.
